## Antenatal Obstetrician Care Among People Who Experience Incarceration in Ontario: A Retrospective Cohort Study

People who had experienced incarceration were less likely to receive antenatal care from an obstetrician during their pregnancy compared to people in the general population of Ontario.

Likelihood of receiving antenatal care by an obstetrician during pregnancies between 2005 and 2015 among persons released from provincial correctional facilities in Ontario in 2010

60% reduced odds than general population
52% reduced odds than general population

**Prison** part of pregnancy overlapped with time incarcerated in provincial correctional facility;

**Prison control** no part of pregnancy overlapped with time incarcerated in provincial facility, but pregnancies: pregnant person was released from custody in 2010;
