
CONTINUITY OF PHYSICIAN CARE OVER THE LAST YEAR OF LIFE

Overall continuity of care (degree to which patients experience their health care as connected and coordinated between health care providers) is low in the last year of life.

Lower continuity among patients with:

- Younger age
- Co-morbidity
- Terminal illness (i.e. cancer) cause of death
- Organ failure cause of death



Higher continuity among patients with:

- Older age
- Rural residence
- Frailty cause of death
- Sudden (unexpected) causes of death
